Have your say on what 'quality of life' means



The ONS is holding a wide-ranging review of how best to define “quality of life” for people in the UK.

The [National Well-being Framework](#) was first created over a decade ago, shaped by 34,000 responses to a national debate. This review, which opened on 3 October, also considers how the ONS should best communicate its well-being insights.

First Census 2021 insights into UK Armed Forces veterans to be published

The first-ever England & Wales census data on [UK Armed Forces veterans](#) will be published by the ONS on 10 November 2022.

This vital information on past service in the UK Armed Forces will help service providers and others to support veterans in line with the Armed Forces Covenant.

It will show numbers of veterans for all geographical areas down to Middle Super Output Area (MSOA) level. It will also provide information on the number of veterans living in private households, the numbers living in communal establishments as well as the number of households with veterans.

Further information on other characteristics of veterans such as health, education and employment will follow in further ONS releases next year.

The [demography & migration](#) topic summary has already been announced for 2 November 2022.

The remaining census topic summaries will be published in a rolling programme throughout November, December and early 2023, followed by multivariate data and analysis.

Webinar date & time: 15th November 2022, 11am



Webinar title: Is the rising cost of living forcing consumers into a self-imposed lockdown?

Webinar description: Consumers are re-evaluating all spend in the run up to Christmas, as disposable incomes are facing a significant squeeze – on average, households across the UK will be -5% less well off than they were in March 2022, with significant fluctuations in what these figures are across regions and catchments. Those anticipating using a foodbank over the next six months has more than doubled to 1 in 9 households, and over a million households are now living beyond their means in the run up to the holiday season.

This Christmas will be different from anything we have seen before as we are in a post pandemic economic crisis, with unprecedented levels of low consumer confidence in the UK. Does all of this mean that consumers will go into a self-imposed lockdown to cut their spending? What will the material impact of this be on landlords and occupiers? What does the picture look like for January and beyond as we likely move into recession?
